



Restaurants/Pubs



Just the southern end of the University campus is shown above at the top right. The buildings relevant to the Euroschool are indicated (Stephenson Institute, CTH and Vine Court). The main road in this area of Liverpool is Hardman Street, shown roughly at the centre. Along this street are many pubs and restaurants, some of which are shown above. At the junction with Hope Street is the Liverpool Philharmonic Hall, and, just over the road, the Philharmonic Dining Rooms, which is a famous pub and restaurant.

There are also a couple of Tesco Metro stores within a few minutes of the Euroschool venue, where you can get general goods. The two Cathedrals of Liverpool are indicated, one at each end of Hope Street. While the Anglican Cathedral is rightly famous as the largest Anglican cathedral in the world, the Catholic Cathedral is certainly worth a visit too — don't let its exterior dissuade you.
